

The Gathering

When the bell rings, please stand as the ministers enter.

In the name of the Father,
and of the Son,
and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen.

The Lord be with you

All: and also with you.

Words of welcome and introduction may be given.

Prayers of Penitence

A minister invites the people to confess their sins. A short time of silence is kept for personal reflection, then,

**All: Almighty God, our heavenly Father,
we have sinned against you
and against our neighbour
in thought and word and deed,
through negligence, through weakness,
through our own deliberate fault.
We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,
who died for us,
forgive us all that is past
and grant that we may serve you
in newness of life
to the glory of your name. Amen.**

The President pronounces God's forgiveness.

Gloria in Excelsis

**All: Glory to God in the highest,
and peace to his people on earth.
Lord God, heavenly King,
almighty God and Father,
we worship you, we give you thanks,
we praise you for your glory.**

**Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,
Lord God, Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world:
have mercy on us;
you are seated at the right hand of the Father:
receive our prayer.**

**For you alone are the Holy One,
you alone are the Lord,
you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ,
with the Holy Spirit,
in the glory of God the Father.
Amen.**

The Collect

The president introduces a short period of silent prayer and then says The Collect, to which all respond,

All: Amen.

Please sit

The Liturgy of the Word

The Readings

One or two readings come before the Gospel.

At the end of each the reader may say

This is the word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

A Psalm may also follow the Old Testament Reading.

Gospel Reading

Please stand

Alleluia!

All: Alleluia!

Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening.

You have the words of eternal life.

All: Alleluia!

The Lord be with you

All: and also with you.

Hear the Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to N.

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you, O Christ.

The Sermon

Please sit. After the sermon, a short time of silence is kept, for reflection.

Please stand

All: We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God,
begotten, not made,
of one Being with the Father;
through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation

he came down from heaven,
was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary
and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;
he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again
in accordance with the Scriptures;
he ascended into heaven

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory
to judge the living and the dead,
and his kingdom will have no end.

**We believe in the Holy Spirit,
the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,
who with the Father and the Son
is worshipped and glorified,
who has spoken through the prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism
for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come.
Amen.**

Prayers of Intercession

Please sit

The following response may be used

Lord, in your mercy
All: hear our prayer.

At the end

Merciful Father
**All: accept these prayers
for the sake of your Son,
our Saviour Jesus Christ.
Amen.**

The Peace

Please stand

The president introduces the Peace and then says,

The Peace of the Lord be always with you
All: and also with you.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

We offer one another a sign of peace in a physically distanced way such as looking around at others and smiling, nodding, waving or bowing. Please remain in your pew.

As the altar is prepared music will be played. Please be seated.

The Eucharistic Prayer

Please stand

The Lord be with you
All: and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.
All: We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
All: It is right to give thanks and praise.

The president praises God for God's mighty acts and all respond,

**All: Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.**

The president recalls the Last Supper; then, we acclaim

Great is the mystery of faith:
**All: Christ has died:
Christ is risen:
Christ will come again.**

The prayer continues; at the end, all respond

... for ever and ever.
All: Amen.

The Lord's Prayer

Let us pray with confidence as our Saviour has taught us

**All: Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come;
thy will be done;
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those
who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
the power and the glory,
for ever and ever.
Amen.**

Breaking of the Bread

We break this bread
to share in the Body of Christ

**All: Though we are many, we are one body,
because we all share in one bread.**

Agnus Dei

**All: Jesus, Lamb of God,
have mercy on us.**

**Jesus, bearer of our sins,
have mercy on us.**

**Jesus, redeemer of the world,
grant us peace.**

Giving of Communion

Jesus is the Lamb of God
who takes away the sin of the world.
Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

**All: Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,
but only say the word, and I shall be healed.**

*The president receives Communion in both kinds and then invites the
congregation to receive in one kind only, using these words*

The body and blood of Christ keep you in eternal life.
All: Amen.

If you wish to receive Communion or a blessing, please sanitize your hands and then come forward one household or bubble at a time, as directed by the stewards. The host will be dropped into your hands without words. Blessings will be given silently and without touching.

If you prefer not to come forward for Communion, you may find this Prayer for Spiritual Communion helpful.

In union, dear Father,
with Christian people throughout the world
and across the centuries
gathered to make Eucharist,
hearing your holy Word
and receiving the Precious Body and Blood,
I offer you praise and thanksgiving.
Even though I am unable this day
to receive the Blessed Sacrament,
I pray that you will unite me with all the baptised
and with your Son who gave his life for us.
Come Lord Jesus,
dwell in me and send your Holy Spirit
that I may be filled with your presence
and may never be separated from you.
Amen.

Prayer after Communion

The president says the post-Communion prayer, then

**All: Almighty God,
we thank you for feeding us
with the body and blood
of your Son Jesus Christ.
Through him we offer you
our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice.
Send us out in the power of your Spirit
to live and work to your praise and glory.
Amen.**

The Dismissal

The Blessing

**All: The Lord be with you
and also with you.**

... and the blessing of God almighty,
the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit,
be among you and remain with you always.

All: Amen

The Dismissal

**All: Go in the peace of Christ.
Thanks be to God.**
